Professional Military Education. Theory, Practice, and Perspective. International Forum Collection of Papers (April 29, 2026). Ministry of Defence of Ukraine, National Defence University of Ukraine. Professional Military Education Institute 'Leadership School'. ROYAL DANISH DEFENCE COLLEGE. Kyiv: NDUU, 2026. 224 p. The collection includes the abstracts of reports by the participants of the International Forum 'Professional Military Education. Theory, Practice, and Perspectives' held on April 29, 2026, at the National Defence University of Ukraine. The materials contain theoretical and practical results of scientific research dedicated to security and defence development under the conditions of fullscale invasion. The primary focus of the collection is centered on four key areas:

- Transformation of Professional Military Education: addresses the processes of adapting curricula to NATO standards, integrating unique Ukrainian lessons learned into the training process in real time, and developing the institutional capacity of military educational institutions.
- Military Leadership: explores models for forming adaptive leadership, ethical dimensions of commander activities, the development of critical and creative thinking, as well as psychological aspects of personnel readiness for combat missions.
- Lessons Learned: highlights mechanisms for collecting, analyzing, and implementing combat experience into the military command and education system to increase the effectiveness of troop training.
- Artificial Intelligence and Digital Technologies: analyzes the prospects of using AI, analytical systems, and simulation technologies (VR/AR) in military education, as well as the ethical, legal, and organizational aspects of their application.

The publication is intended for faculty, researchers, postgraduate students (PhD students), students, and cadets of higher military educational institutions, as well as representatives of military command and control authorities whose activities are related to the reform of military education and the implementation of innovations in the Armed Forces of Ukraine. The materials are presented in the authors' edition; the responsibility for the content and accuracy of the published results, as well as for the absence of restricted information, rests with the authors of the papers. The collection of papers was prepared for publication by the Department of Leadership of the Professional Military Education Institute 'Leadership School' of the National Defence University of Ukraine.
